New Beginnings


As with any organisation the church is always looking for ways to improve how it functions within and how it serves God and others.

News from the Schools

Advent and Christmas saw a busy schedule with the three schools that we work in. The Children kicked off the season with a Christingle Service to set the tone for Waiting in Hope for Jesus. Every year, one of the highlights of the service is for the

children to see which lucky teacher will be donning the inflatable Orange Christingle Suit! This year Mr Morris, Mrs Campbell and Mrs Stephenson did the honours much to the delight of all the pupils! As we lit our Christingles, we reflected on Jesus the Light of the World and how we can be like Him to be light bearers in the world.



In October, Tritlington First School welcomed a new Governor, Mrs Linda Fugill to the team. As a church school, it is a privilege to offer our support as a church to the governance and guidance of the school. Governors play a vital role in helping to shape the character of the school and work closely with the headteachers and staff to monitor and evaluate good practice in supporting the teaching and learning of pupils. In a church of England School, church governors are responsible for helping to shape the Christian character of the school and support staff in developing Collective Worship and Spiritual development. At Tritlington, the School Vision is 'Let your Light Shine' The Vision for the school springs from Jesus Christ's teaching in his 'Sermon on the Mount'.

The children had a wonderful morning experiencing the Christmas story during our 'Experience Christmas' event. They journeyed through the Nativity, reflecting on the key figures and their significance. Together, we considered Mary's brave decision to become Jesus' mother, Joseph's trust in God's plan, the shepherds' faithful response to the angels' message, and the kind innkeeper's creative solution in offering a place for the Holy Family. These moments helped us think about how we can see God at work in our own lives.

The morning concluded with a fun manger craft activity, which the children thoroughly enjoyed. They were also delighted by a special visit from 'Sheila the Sheep,' who shared her perspective on that extraordinary night when the angels appeared to announce Jesus' birth to the shepherds on the hillside. What a night that must have been!





Storytime Church

In September, we launched our new *Storytime Church*—a monthly service designed especially for small children and their families. Held on the third Sunday of each month at 4 p.m. in church, this delightful gathering offers a warm and welcoming space for little ones to explore the Bible through the adventures of Dolly and Teddy.

Services and Events over Christmas

Advent and Christmas brought people together from across our communities as we prepared for and celebrated the birth of Jesus Christ. The season began with an Advent Carol Service at Hebron, where we reflected on the anticipation of Jesus' arrival through scripture, carols, and thoughtful contemplation.

The festivities continued with a Christingle celebration at Hebron, where local community members joined Tritlington School pupils, staff, and parents. On Sunday, December 22nd, Mitford Church hosted a delightful, lively service filled with joy and creativity. The congregation was entertained by a charming yet somewhat distracted Millennial Angel recounting her visit to Mary (when she could remember to put her phone down!), a flustered innkeeper dealing with the chaos of census-time Bethlehem, and three "Uptown Funking" Kings presenting their gifts to Jesus. Together, we sang carols and enjoyed music from the band and musicians, reflecting on our collective journey to the manger. The service ended on a heartwarming note as children joined the baby Jesus in the stable for an impromptu rendition of *Away in a Manger*.

On Christmas Eve, we gathered to hear a creative retelling of the Journey to the Manger. Traditional carols and readings brought the story of the first Christmas to life. Children placed the Nativity characters at the crib and lovingly laid baby Jesus in the manger before everyone enjoyed fellowship over mulled wine and mince pies. Later that night, at 11 p.m., brave souls ventured out again for a Communion service, welcoming Christ on Christmas Day with reverence and joy.

It was a true delight to see so many new and familiar faces in our churches throughout the Christmas season. Together, we reflected on how the ancient story of Jesus—Emmanuel, God with us—continues to inspire and renew our hearts year after year, touching people of all ages in meaningful ways.
