Every six years, we are required to prepare a brand-new electoral roll for our parishes, and 2025 is one of those years. This means that **everyone who wishes to be included on the electoral roll will need to complete a new application form**, even if you were on the previous roll.

The electoral roll is a vital part of parish life. It allows you to have a say in important decisions about the church's future, including the election of Churchwardens and members of the Parochial Church Council (PCC). Being on the roll also reflects your commitment to our parish and its mission.

## News from Cambo First School

'Happy New Year to everyone from all your friends at Cambo First School'.



And what a start to the new year. Snow, snow, snow! None at Christmas but lots on the 5th/6th January 2025! Enough to make a snowman, create snow art and make snow angels on the field! With frozen fingers and frozen toes, it was good to get back into school for a

warm drink!



January 2025 started with a change in the topical areas being covered!

This term in class 2, the children are focusing much of their work on the theme 'Stone age to Iron Age' via our history enquiry question: Was Stone Age Man, simply a hunter gatherer, concerned only with survival? The children will be learning about factors that led to Stone Age hunter-gatherers settling into early farming communities and how these settlements in turn developed into hillforts in the iron age. The children will also be learning about the changes in materials, tools, culture and the way of life in communities! visits, visitors and creatives... to be confirmed!



Our younger children are also finding out about Florence Nightingale, who she was, what she did, who she helped, why she was known as the lady with the lamp and the impact she had on nursing and medicine historically and today! Kathy Anderson and Anne Hedley continue to work with us once again. This term we will be learning songs linked to the seasons and extreme weather which is part of our Geography focus. We will also be fine tuning our whole school music playing through percussion, recorder, ukulele and Violins, even at lunch times! Hopefully all of the children will gain their music award at the end of the year.

### Reverse Advent Calendar

Last term the R.E. Ambassadors voted to support the Wansbeck Food Bank and joined in their Reverse Advent Calendar, and donated gifts for an Advent Box. Each box had 24 items including toiletries, food staples, small gifts for children and some Christmas-based items like mince pies and other treats. We were able to create two full boxes and donated additional items to go towards a third. Thank you so much to all of our children and parents for supporting such a worthy cause.

### Eco-Team

Our Eco-Team have been identifying the recycling challenges they want to set school for this year and have created posters to remind us what we can do. They chose four areas that they wanted to focus on, both at school and at home.

In school, they would specifically like teachers and children to think about the amount of paper they use, to reduce paper use and to recycle where possible. We are collecting ring-pulls (from cans and tins) which can be melted down by a charity to help repair wheelchairs.



We use a lot of whiteboard pens and felt pens and we are collecting the rigid plastic outer shells to recycle them, rather than throw them away as landfill. Finally, we are promoting the recycling of batteries through the Big Battery Hunt, where all children were given boxes to take home to encourage recycling. ### Fire Engine Visit

We all enjoyed a visit from the Fire Service linked to our safety curriculum. The fire fighters brought the Fire Engine onto the school yard and we were able to try the big hose. It was just the best!

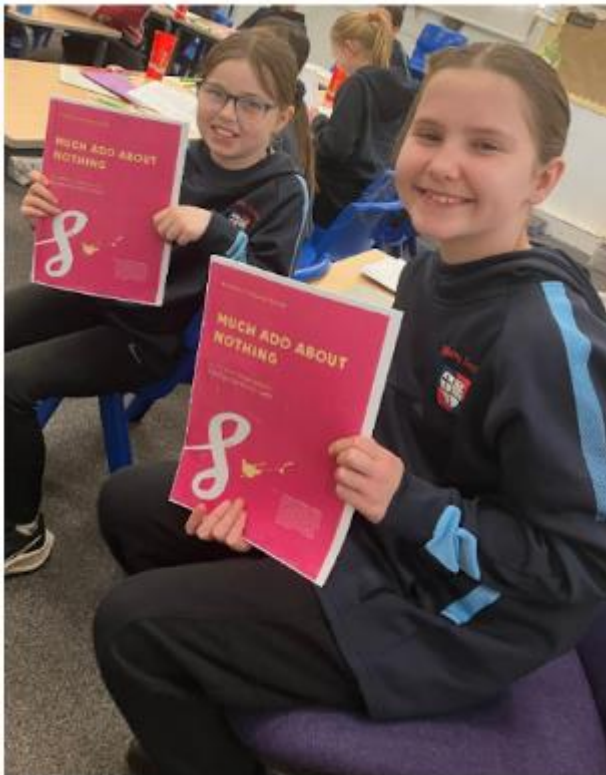


### *News from Belsay School Cont.*
