Editor's Note:



Hello and welcome to the next edition of Upper Wansbeck News.

I recently attended the Whalton Parish Council surgery session held by our local councillor Lyle Darwin at Whalton Village Hall where many topics were discussed. The main one that interested me was related to my correspondence I shared with many of you a few weeks ago 'why the new 777 Bus service doesn't include the villages of Ogle and Whalton'. Councillor Darwin explained that this issue had been raised many times with him and he is currently trying to find out who approved the route as there appears not to have been any consultation done with the people

who would potentially use this service. He has it on his agenda and will be carrying out his own investigations into how many people are actually using this service in its' current format. As he highlighted to us during the meeting, it is taxpayers' money that is paying for the service and so far it doesn't appear to be well used.

Other topics that were discussed during the meeting included,

- the speed signs in and around Whalton particularly the 20mph sections which don't appear to be adhered to.
- The cars parking near to Whalton school at peak times and the concern around potential accidents.
- Broadband speeds.
- 4-wheel drive vehicles and motorbikes churning up the ground near Ogle where the burn is.
- The standard of the grass cutting by the council in the village of Ogle
- The maintenance of the roads and flooding just outside Ogle when the drains are blocked.

News from Cambo School

Where has this year gone? Indeed, where has the time gone in general? I think the older you get the quicker the time flies. The summer term has come around very quickly this year. We can hardly believe we will be saying goodbye to our Year 4s very soon, But, before that, there are still a number of activities to enjoy, along with a summer of European Football and the Olympics! Fingers crossed the good weather holds for us.



Our focus area for learning this term is the 'Romans', some say those rotten romans... but were they really rotten? Using primary and secondary source material, visitors and visits, we plan to investigate how and why the Romans successfully invaded Britain; the strategies and techniques they used in battle, and who the people in Britain actually were that they were fighting, Including Boudica! We are also researching the everyday life of a Roman

soldier, what they wore and how the army was organised. And finally, we are finding out about What life was like generally in Roman Britain and how the Romans influenced our life today. PHEW a lot to get through in half a term and guess what our annual sleepover will be linked to?

This term we were so fortunate to have Virpi Kettu come into school to work with all of



the children on their Animations skills. Virpi is a professional artist/animator. The children were so impressed to learn that she had been part of the animation team at Aardman Animations creating Wallace and Gromit movies! AND she had even completed animations for Katie Perry's songs and videos! But wow... we were really impressed when we saw our Cambo school animation of Jack and the Beanstalk

which we shared with the whole community. The experience has really spurred the children on to create more... I see Roman stories and lots, lots, more on the horizon!

In May our Y4 children took part in our annual residential to Robinwood, along with the Y4s from Longhorsley, and Whalton. We had three days of OAA activities. The foci were: challenge, resilience, communication, collaboration and problem solving.



What fun we had canoeing, climbing, orienteering and lots, lots, more! with wonderful weather from rain to radiant sunshine. Who could ask for more? With transition on the horizon it was a brilliant opportunity to also meet new friends and rekindle old friendships!


